1. It keeps Gadsden, Leon, Madison and Hamilton Counties whole.

2. It reaches the black voting age population (BVAP) required by the Florida Supreme Court and approved in Martinez.

3. It creates the east-west congressional district the Florida Supreme Court said "must" be drawn.

4. It creates a balance between the eastern and western portions of the district giving each an equal chance of supporting a winning candidate.

As a final note, almost any congressional district which keeps Leon County intact would be acceptable. The Florida Supreme Court ruled the Florida Legislature should respect political and geographical boundaries in three (3) specific instances: Hendry County; City of Homestead; and, the two Districts that crossed Tampa Bay between Hillsborough and Pinellas Counties.

If this District, or any similar District that keeps Leon County in one Congressional District, is adopted I would be prepared to present testimony on its behalf.

If a District is proposed that splits Leon County then I would like to be given the opportunity to testify against that proposal.

It is feasible to avoid splitting Leon County while meeting the directives of the Florida Supreme Court.
